JEWELS OF SMH - Rev. Dr. John Scudder II, M.D., D.D.,



Dr. John Scudder II, the youngest son of Rev. Dr. John Scudder Sr, the founder of the Arcot American mission was born on October 29, 1835, in Chavagacherry, Ceylon, where his parents were serving as missionaries for the American Board of Missions at the time. He was one of seven brothers whose names are closely linked to the development and accomplishments of the American Arcot mission in India. Dr. John Scudder II served 39 years in India.

Along with his parents, he spent his early years in India, where he was immediately exposed to all the difficult aspects of missionary life. One such incident was when his father was very ill with Jungle Fever and Mrs. Harriet Scudder along with her little son John had to travel day and night on the jungle road in the midst of prowling tigers and stomping elephants ,even abandoned by their bearers, they finally managed to reach Mr. Scudder.



Dr. John Scudder was sent to America to complete his education. He initially studied in Hudson, Ohio, where he publicly confessed his faith in Christ, joined the church, and immediately decided to dedicate his life to missionary work.

He continued his education, earning degrees from the Theological Seminary of New Brunswick in 1860 and Rutgers College in 1857. In the same year, he received his ordination and his preaching license.

Dr. Scudder received his medical degree from the Long Island Medical College, and the honorary degree of Doctor of Divinity from Rutgers College in 1896.

On January 1, 1861 in Summit Ohio, Dr. John Scudder II married Miss L. Sophia Weld, of Hudson, Ohio and on 11th March 1861 Mrs and Dr. John Scudder, sailed for India from Boston to join the mission, arriving in India in July. He was 26 years old. He was tall and broad like his father the same impetuousness as him but his mother's sweetness of disposition.

Dr. John II, though youngest of the seven Scudder brothers, was neither weak nor submissive. When in 1861 he returned to India to join the Arcot Mission founded by three of his brothers, some of the spirit of rebellion then activating his homeland came with him.

Finding what he considered injustice on the mission field, he wrote a letter to the mission board of his denomination in bold and sharp protest of low mission salaries. Soundly censured by the board, he was about to resign when, all the other members of the mission threatening to resign with him, the board withdrew its censure and managed through a convenient donation to raise the salaries.

But the incident had an impact on Dr. John's career as a whole. His board reports were brief and sporadic. He was assigned the hardest posts by his own choice and relocated frequently.

As a doctor he was called to visit many homes in the town. But much of his time was spent in touring a wide circuit of villages where Christian work had been established. It took him sixteen days to tour them all, including three Sundays. For it was in the villages, with their desperate poverty, their large communities of untouchables, that most converts had been made.

He worked in Chittoor from 1861 to 1863, Arni from 1863 to 1865, Arcot from 1865 to 1876, and Vellore from 1876 to 1877.

After serving on the field for seventeen years straight, he returned to America in 1878 with Mrs. Scudder and lived in Nebraska for four years.

Dr. Scudder returned to India in 1882 and was sent to the following locations: Arni, 1882-1885; Tindivanam, 1885-1892, where he constructed the church and a spacious mission home; and Vellore, 1892-1894

At Tindivanam, he built the church and a large mission home that he constructed with his typical enthusiasm and optimism, adequate to house several hundred individuals.

Dr. John was in charge of a boarding school for nearly a hundred boys, roughly half of whom were Hindus and the other half were Christians from nearby villages where converts had been made.

During public preaching events, such as temple festivals, Dr. John faced instances of heckling; however, he maintained a composed demeanor, akin to that of delivering a sermon from the secure confines of his newly established church in Tindivanam. With confidence and without disruption, his powerful voice conveyed the message of hope he intended to share in that setting.

Chaplaincy Report for the months of Jan & Feb 2025

The morning devotions in the chapel have been a blessing. Beginning every day with a song of praise to our **Lord** and listening to His word each day has been a privilege. It was good to see that most of those who had been invited to share the devotions did so with much preparation. To attend daily means to receive a rich treasure of encouragement.

Department prayers and short Bible devotions have been held regularly in the following departments: Finance, STP, ASSET, Purchase and General Stores, MRD, Physiotherapy, Drug store, Laboratory, Maintenance and Transport departments. These brief gatherings around the Word have been an encouragement. It is heartening to note that our staff have been eager to make space for such times amidst their busy schedules without affecting their daily routines.

The Chaplains have also taken time to walk with some of our staff who are going through difficult times in their homes due to sickness or want or bereavement. It has been a learning experience to know that some of our staff have been carrying out their responsibilities amidst very difficult circumstances at their homes.

There is also the beautiful responsibility to care for our students. Every week a large number of students from the Allied health services have gathered for a time of fellowship in the Chapel on Saturdays. It is being explored to have smaller groups to deepen engagement with these students. One such voluntary group has begun to meet with handful of students. The Nursing student have the CE program which is coordinated among themselves. One of the chaplains had the opportunity to meet with them.

There was also an enjoyable retreat for the nursing students in our hospital. The chaplains coordinated a very meaningful 'activity time' in which spiritual truths were set in fun filled participatory activities. This was followed by a time in which there was a session about forgiveness and eternal life in Christ.

Visits to staff homes has begun in a small way. It was a privilege listening to the stories of their ongoing engagement with our mission. Some of them have given most of their years to our work and held on amidst the ups and downs of their lives. Singing and praying with them has been such blessing to us.

The visits to our patients at the bedside has been a very enjoyable part of the work. We are very touched by the way many of our patients have welcomed us and shared their anxieties and fears with us. Many of them have been happy to have us pray for them. Life enriching literature and calendars have been shared with many of them.

It has been a privilege to participate in our hospital programs like the dedication of the new quarters and the Lamp Lighting Ceremony and the small program on Republic Day.

We also had a very meaningful 'Healing ministry week' in the Hospital from 9th to 15th February. The CMAI booklet with devotions were thought provoking. Every day one of our staff members shared on the given text. On 14th Feb we had a time where all staff and students were invited for a special service in which the truths learned during the week were summarized. We also printed small stickers saying 'I am a healing minister of Christ' in the local language. Many of our staff and students wore it on our ID cards and bags. Some of us still use it to remind ourselves about who we are. On the whole, the 'healing ministry week' was a blessing.

Amidst these works we have also found small unplanned but enriching times of fellowship among ourselves where we have discussed our mission and planned our inputs.








HEALING MINISTRY WEEK








SMH Happenings - Major News & Events
